### WEEKLY GARBAGE AND REFUSE COLLECTION

**REFUSE is collected MONDAYS & TUESDAYS unless there is a holiday. When collection falls on a holiday, pick-up will occur the NEXT DAY. Village holidays are listed on page 4.**

**RECYCLING is collected every WEDNESDAY unless there is a holiday. When collection falls on a holiday, pick-up will occur the NEXT DAY. Please see the recycling calendar on page 1 to determine whether it is a “paper” or “container” recycling week. Residents can bring recycling to the DPW Garage, 389 Scottsville-Mumford Rd., during hours Village is working.**

#### Permits and Fee's

The \$1.00, \$5.00, \$10.00, and any additional assessment fees for extra trash , refuse or special items must be processed through the Village Office between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday. A label will be given to you for your placement on the item (it shows you paid the fee). You may also mail this to the Village Office, P.O. Box 36, Scottsville, NY 14546. Make checks payable to the Village of Scottsville. If unsure, please call ahead, (585) 889-6050.

1. There is a limit of One Toter of Garbage/Refuse Per Week Per Resident without extra charge. A Second Toter may be leased for a one time charge of \$50.00. There is an additional \$1.00 charge for containers and bags in excess.  
**GARBAGE/REFUSE MUST BE AT CURBSIDE BY 7:00 A.M.**
2. There is a \$5.00 charge per item of FURNITURE, MATTRESSES, and like items.
3. CARPETING HAS A SPECIAL FEE STRUCTURE BASED ON AMOUNT AND QUANTITY.
4. There is a \$10.00 charge per item for all COOLANT APPLIANCES (air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, etc.) and TVs.
5. There is a \$1.00 charge per 5 gallon bucket of CONCRETE PRODUCTS, ROCKS, STONES, DIRT, etc. It will not be picked up if not in proper containers.
6. There is no charge for metal products if placed in neat piles or containers.
7. Wood products, such as 2 by x's, must be nail-free, and placed in bundles not to exceed 4 feet in length and not heavier than 50 pounds, and no more than 4 bundles per household per week.

#### **PLEASE READ: NEW LEAF, BRUSH and DEBRIS**

1. There will be WEEKLY leaf vacuuming during OCTOBER thru EARLY DECEMBER. Dates will be posted. NO BRUSH PICK-UP DURING LEAF SEASON.
2. Leaves must be raked as close as possible to the road and in long rows (if possible) instead of a big mound.
3. Grass clippings and all lawn rakings MUST BE PLACED IN RECYCLABLE PAPER BAGS. NO PLASTIC BAGS. **Paper bags for lawn debris are available for purchase at most home improvement stores.**
4. DO NOT BAG LEAVES OR USE CONTAINERS during this time.
5. DO NOT MIX BRUSH, NUTS, APPLES, OR OTHER TRASH with the leaves at this time.
6. BRUSH, TREE TRIMMINGS, SHRUBBERY, other yard waste will be picked up APRIL through SEPTEMBER during the regular refuse collection cycles, except for weather-related emergencies. If yard waste is generated outside of scheduled general collection period – Please call the DPW to make arrangement for pick-up – Charges may apply.
7. The above must be cut into 4 foot lengths, tied & bundled. It must not be more than 4” in diameter, and must not be heavier than 50 pounds. Limit 5 bundles per week. If these conditions are not met, it will not be picked up.
8. Village residents may drop off their brush at the DPW Brush Recycling Center during the work week. Please call ahead. Proof of residency required for dumping.

9. The DPW Brush Recycling Center will be open 8:00 A.M. until 12:00 Noon EVERY SATURDAY in APRIL and MAY and the LAST SATURDAY of JUNE, JULY, AUGUST, and SEPTEMBER for dropping off BRUSH ONLY. Proof of residency required for dumping.
10. If large amounts of brush need to be hauled away, a Village resident may have a DPW truck dropped off at a charge of \$25 per day. Please call ahead for this option.
11. Landscape contractors (and similar yard-related contractors) performing work for village residents must obtain a permit from the Village and get a signed statement from the homeowner in order to be allowed to use the DPW Brush Recycling Center for the resident’s yard clean up.
12. Removal of trees, plants, and shrubbery on private property is the sole responsibility of the homeowner.
13. Removal of home improvement and construction debris, including and not limited to roofing materials, drywall, plywood, sinks, etc., is the sole responsibility of the home owner.

**Miscellaneous**

1. All business garbage collection will be once per week during the normal refuse collection cycle. If requested, an additional pickup on Friday can be arranged for an additional charge.
2. Trash and refuse generated outside the Village will not be picked up. Violators will be prosecuted.
3. Set out Garbage/Trash by 7:00 A.M. on your collection day. **Do not set trash out more than 24 hours prior to scheduled pick up.**

- No Items larger than 4 feet square
- No Drums or Closed Containers without being washed.
- No liquids, hazardous, or toxic waste materials
- No drums or closed containers without being washed. Both ends must be removed, and the drums must be crushed.
