REPORTS: Attorney Peter Skivington

- Monroe County Radio Agreement – The agreement is in “perpetuity.” As long as the County has the system, we must buy future radios. The first group of radios is included in the agreement. Scottsville EMS Chief Matt Jarrett will need to address the Board in the near future to detail the installation costs that the Village must pay on the first group of radios that is being provided. The agreement cannot be terminated. We just need to be sure that the startup radio cost of around \$30,000 is covered by the County.
- Sewer Easements – They are with the County waiting to be signed. Once the County signs them, they will be returned for the Village and Town (Wheatland) to sign. The easements are being run through “Pure Waters.” We can’t complete the property transfer to the County until the easements are signed and filed.
- Attorney Skivington asked for an Executive Session to discuss the legal issues involved with 60 Main Street and legal issues between the Town and Village.
- Local Law #3-2015 was drafted to reflect 24 hour parking restrictions on Main Street. If any changes are needed, they can be defined through the upcoming public hearing.

Mayor Gee opened up the public hearing to public comment at 6:48 PM.

Mayor Gee explained that the way the law was presented to the public was that we would do 2-hour parking on Main Street 24 hours a day, six days a week (Sundays and holidays excluded). It was also discussed that from 2:00 AM to 6:00 AM there would be no parking at all, all year long.

Nick Pearl asked why we were excluding Sundays. That is a busy day for the Diner and Salvatore’s. Nick said his biggest worry is wintertime with snow.

Mayor Gee said that he would leave in Sundays and holidays, but add “No parking from 2:00 AM to 6:00 AM.”

DPW Superintendent Farrell said that the entry signs to the Village would need to be changed to reflect the no parking time.

Trustee R. Clark suggested making the no parking time from 3:00 AM to 6:00 AM so that they are in sync with the current entry sign notification. Mayor Gee agreed. This would be year-round and just for Main Street. The signs will still need to be redone for Main Street.

The discussion continued. After discussion, the Village Board reverted back to the original published law.

Mayor Gee closed the public comment at 7:00 PM. and opened the floor to Board comment.

There were no additional Board comments. The public hearing was closed at 7:00 PM.

- Leaf pickup is keeping us busy. We are able to make more than 2 runs through the village each week.
- Parade of Lights – December 4th – Fire Police will be acting as crossing guards with traffic flowing through Main Street. Mayor Gee said the Department of Transportation Special Use Permit has been filed, but it does not appear that there will be any road closure (as requested on permit). Cones will be in place to reserve spots for the fire trucks to park.
- Sidewalk in the Briarwood track is sealed. We will replace some broken lights soon.
- Tree work throughout the village will most likely take place towards the end of the year. We may have to go with Birchcrest since they have the county contract this year. 5 Ash trees will be taken down by DPW. The Bradford Pear on Main Street will need to stay up until it's decided what to replace it with.
- First load of salt (100 ton) was delivered last week.
- We will get one plow truck set up later this week or early next week. The 2004 International plow truck is at Caledonia Diesel getting the dump body and other repairs done. This is the truck we decided to refurb instead of getting a new truck.
- Will install the camera system at the highway department soon. SG Security was lower than Tyco who has the state contract. Johnson Park will also get cameras.
- Dog park update – Mr. Farrell met with New York State Fence. They will be getting some prices to him. The plan is to utilize the gate that is already on the site. No prices on equipment yet. We have 6 tables from Johnson Park and 5 new ones. We still have to get a price for running a water line. The Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Mr. Farrell will meet when all the issues have answers.
- All Christmas lights and banners will go up soon. I may have to put them up next week, but I won't power them up till after Thanksgiving. Do we want another tree for the triangle? Yes. We have 16 lighted (white lights) wreaths that could be used in Johnson Park.
- Todd Schwasman will do the dispatching this winter.
- Salvatore's needs to get billed for the extra toter pickup on Fridays. Back on May 12th, the Board agreed to bill Salvatore's \$68.93 per month for the extra toter pickup, but no bill was ever sent. The current amount owed is \$413.58 for 6 months of pickups. The Village Clerk will discuss the issue with Mr. Pearl and set up a payment plan for the future.
- Come & Go sewer lateral – There is a leak in it as it goes to our main on Grove Street. It is a private lateral and the property owner is responsible for the repair.
